Biographies of Participants

Ana AGUADO Cornago is Secretary General of the European Distribution System Operators for Smart Grids (EDSO). She was previously Chief Executive Officer of Friends of the Supergrid (FOSG), a group of companies with a mutual interest in promoting the policy agenda for a European supergrid. Prior to joining FOSG, Ms. Aguado held various high-level positions within the energy sector, including Head of the Brussels Office at the European University Institute, Secretary General at ETSO (European Association of Transmission System Operators), Head of Unit for Regulation at EURELECTRIC (umbrella association for the European electricity industry), and within the European Commission's Directorate-General for Energy. Ms. Aguado holds degrees in Law from the University of Valencia, Spain, an M.A. in Business Law from the University of London, and an M.A. in Private International Law from The Hague University.

Jason ANDERSON is Head of Climate and Energy Policy at the World Wildlife Federation's European Policy Office. He is also the chair of the board of Climate Action Network Europe. He was a lead author of the IPCC special reports on ozone and climate interactions and carbon capture and storage and was acknowledged in 2007 for his contribution to the IPCC's Nobel Peace Prize. Previously, he was a Senior Fellow at the Institute for European Environmental Policy and a Policy Officer at Climate Action Network Europe. Mr. Anderson earned graduate degrees in Energy and Resources and Public Policy from the University of California, Berkeley, in 1998 and a degree in biological anthropology from Harvard University in 1990.

Laura ANTINARELLI is a Senior Officer at the Government of Italy's Ministry of Economic Development, which she joined in 2003. She works in the Electricity Market Division of the General Directorate for Electricity Market, Renewables and Energy Efficiency, and Nuclear Energy. Previously, she worked in the Electricity Production Division. From 2001–2003, she worked at Acquirente Unico SpA, a company that purchases electricity for default suppliers, where she mapped processes for electricity procurement. Ms. Antinarelli graduated with a degree in Transport Engineering at the Sapienza University of Rome, and she has an M.B.A. from LUISS Guido Carli University in Rome.

Alparslan BAYRAKTAR has been chairman of the Energy Market Regulatory Authority of Turkey (EMRA) since February 2010. Prior to joining EMRA, he worked in a spectrum of industries. From 2007–2010, he ran a consulting and project management business in energy and information technology, managing numerous projects in Turkey. From 2001–2006, he was a business manager for New York-based Goldenline, Inc., responsible for the Northern and Central American regions. From 1998–2001, he specialized in supply chain management, business development, and safety procedures in the liquefied petroleum gas industry in Turkey.

Mr. Bayraktar holds positions in various international organizations and is actively involved in issues relating to regulatory governance. He is the Chairman of Energy Regulators Regional Association (ERRA). Mr. Bayraktar's other international memberships include the Editorial Board of International Confederation of Energy Regulators (ICER) publication, *The ICER Chronicle*, and the International Programme Committee & Steering Committee (as ERRA representative) of the World Forum on Energy Regulation VI (WFER). Mr. Bayraktar received his bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from Istanbul Technical University. He earned a master's degree (LL.M.) in Law and Economics from Bilkent University, Faculty of Law in Ankara. He also studied Strategic Marketing Management at New York University.

José CASAS MARIN is General Manager of Institutional Affairs and Regulatory, Iberia, for Endesa—the leading company in the Spanish electricity sector and the second operator in the Portuguese electricity market. Previously at Endesa, he was General Manager of Regulations and Environment from 2010–2014, and he was General Assistant Manager of Strategy, Regulations, Environment and Sustainable Development in Spain and Portugal from 2004–2010. His career at Endesa began in 2000 when he was named Assistant Manager of Tariffs, Tolls and the Sales Function in the Distribution Department. A short time later, he also assumed responsibility for the Departments of Settlements and Regulations for Endesa Red, and of Regulations for Endesa (within the General Energy Management Department). From 1990–2000, he was employed by Arthur Andersen, where he rose to the position of Audit Manager responsible for the Energy, Telecommunications and Industrial Sector areas. Mr. Casas Marin holds a degree in Industrial Engineering from Madrid's Universidad Pontificia Comillas Catholic Institute of Arts and Industry

and completed the General Management Program at IESE, which is the graduate business school of the University of Navarra in Madrid.

Roberta DI LECCE is Networks (Transport, Telecom and Energy) and Climate Change Coordinator at the Italian Permanent Representation to the European Union (EU). She represents Italy in negotiations within the EU, helping shape Italian positions on EU policies, liaising with EU Institutions, fellow diplomats, and other experts, and Italian and other stakeholders, as well following and analyzing EU and international developments.

Monica FRASSONI has been President of the European Alliance to Save Energy, a business organization dedicated to promoting energy efficiency across Europe, since late 2010. She is also Co-President of the European Green Party. She was a Member of the European Parliament from 1999 - 2009 and was also co-chair of the European Greens–European Free Alliance group in the European Parliament. Previously, she served for ten years as an officer of the Greens group in the European Parliament and was Secretary General of the Young European Federalists.

Jean-Michel GLACHANT is the Director of the Florence School of Regulation and Holder of the Loyola de Palacio Chair at the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence, Italy. Previously, Glachant headed the department of economics the University Paris Sud. Prior to that, he was a professor at the Sorbonne. He is a research partner at the MIT Center for Energy and Environmental Policy Research and the Electricity Policy Research Group at Cambridge University. He has been an adviser to various Directorate-Generals at the European Commission and to the French Energy Regulatory Commission. Professor Glachant is editor-in-chief of *EEEP: Economics of Energy & Environmental Policy* (an IAEE journal) and a member of the Council of the International Association for Energy Economics. He earned his Master's degree and Ph.D. in Economics at the Sorbonne in France.

Fernando HERNÁNDEZ Jiménez-Casquet is Director General for Energy at the Spanish Commission for Markets and Competition. Previously, he has been Advisor to the Minister for Energy, Economic and Commercial Counselor at the Embassy of Spain in Germany, Senior Economist at the World Bank, and an Economic Advisor in the Cabinet of the Prime Minister of Spain. He is a Member of the Board of SODIEX, Invest in Spain, Expansión, and the Spanish Corporation of Strategic Hydrocarbon Reserves. He holds a J.D. from the University of Granada, a Master's degree in Public Administration/Economics from the Harvard Kennedy School, and a Master's degree in Advanced European Studies from the College of Europe in Bruges, Belgium.

Ján HUDACKÝ is a Member of the Slovak Parliament (KDH, the opposition party) and Chairman of the Economic Committee of the Slovak Parliament, positions he has held since 2012. Previously, he was State Secretary of the Ministry of Transport, Construction, and Regional Development (KDH, coalition) from 2010–2012 and was a Member of the European Parliament from 2004–2009. Prior to his political career, Mr. Hudacký held various positions, principally in the field of electrical engineering and business counseling. He holds a degree in electrical engineering.

Bruno LIEBHABERG is Director General of Centre on Regulation in Europe (CERRE). He is a professor at the Université Libre de Bruxelles (Free University of Brussels) Solvay Brussels School of Economics and Management. Earlier in his career, he was an adviser on industry and research and development to the former European Commission President Jacques Delors. He holds a Master's degree in Management Sciences from SBS-EM, ULB and a Ph.D. in Industrial Relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

Teresa LUIS-RUIZ has headed Endesa's Brussels Office since 2010. Previously, she was a partner at Bonphil SA, a law firm, and a legal adviser for EU Affairs at Belston. She received a Master's degree in European Law from the Université Libre de Bruxelles (Free University of Brussels) Institute of European Studies and a Bachelor's degree in Law from the University of La Laguna in Tenerife.

Andrei MARCU is Senior Advisor and Head of the Carbon Market Forum at the Center for European Policy Studies in Brussels. Since 2008, he has been a United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change Negotiator. Previously, he was Senior Vice President and Head of Regulatory and Policy Affairs at Mercuria Energy Group; CEO of Bluenext, a Paris-based exchange; Managing Director for Climate & Energy at the World Business Council; and President and CEO of the International Emissions Trading Association, a business association which he founded. Mr. Marcu's career began at Ontario Hydro where, among other responsibilities, he served as Chief of Staff for the Chairman & CEO, Maurice Strong. He received an M.B.A. from the University of Toronto and a Bachelor's degree in Engineering from McGill University.

Guiseppe MONTESANO is Head of European Regulation and Scenarios at Enel SpA. He has held various positions at Enel since 1988, including Head of Environment and Climate Change Policies; Head of International Environmental Regulation and Special Projects; Manager of Network Regulation; Manager of Relations with Energy Regulatory Authorities; and Senior Environmental

Advisor. Mr. Montesano is a Professional Engineer who received his Mechanical Engineering degree from Rome's Sapienza University.

Simon MÜLLER works at the International Energy Agency (IEA), where he is responsible for analysis on Grid- and System-Integration of Renewables. In this capacity, he leads a project team working primarily on the technical and economic aspects of integrating large amounts of wind and solar energy into power systems around the world. From 2012–2014, he was the analytical and managerial lead of a comprehensive IEA project, investigating the technical and economic implications of large scale wind and solar grid integration. Prior to that, his work at the IEA focused primarily on the analysis of renewable energy policies. Before joining the IEA, Mr. Müller worked for the Euro-Mediterranean Energy Market Integration Project in Cairo, Egypt and the German Federal Ministry of the Environment. Mr. Müller studied psychology, math, and physics in Oldenburg, Bremen, and Berlin. He holds a Master's degree in Physics from the University of Bremen with a specialization in theoretical semiconductor physics.

Miroslav OBERT has been the State Secretary at the Ministry of Economy of the Slovak Republic since September 2014 and is responsible for the energy sector and structural funds. Obert has more than thirty years experience in various aspects of the nuclear power sector. As Vice-chair of the Board of Directors for the Nuclear and Decommissioning Company, he accomplished the final part of decommissioning for the entire nuclear energy sector in the Slovak Republic. He also was involved in building a new nuclear source in the Slovak Republic. He is a member of the Supervisory Board of the National Nuclear Fund that focuses on resources for the decommissioning of nuclear facilities. Obert attended Slovak Technical University, Faculty of Electrical Engineering, specializing in Nuclear Power Engineering.

Clara POLETTI has been Director of the Regulatory Department and Director of the Electricity and Gas Market Unit of AEEGSI, the Italian independent regulatory authority for electricity, gas, and water since 2011. In April 2014, she was appointed Co-Chair of the Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (ACER)'s Market Integrity and Transparency Working Group. She was also coordinator of ACER's regional gas initiatives. Before joining AEEGSI, she was Director of IEFÉ, the independent research center of Milan's Bocconi University which specializes in applied research in energy and environmental economics. She has also been the joint academic director of the Centre on Regulation in Europe. Ms. Poletti has a M.Sc. in Economics from the University of London's Birkbeck College and an Economics degree from the University of Pavia.

Alberto POTOTSCHNIG is the first Director of the European Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (ACER), established in 2010. He was appointed in May 2010 and took office on September 16, 2010. Prior to joining ACER, he was a partner in Mercados EMI, a Madrid-based international consultancy specializing in the energy sector, where he was CEO and Deputy Chairman. He previously worked at the Italian Transmission System Operators, served as first CEO of the Italian Electricity Market Operator and in the Italian Energy Regulatory Authority, with his final position being Director of Electricity Regulation. From 2003–2005, he was an adviser to the Italian government on environmental policy issues. He has been an adviser at the Florence School of Regulation since 2004, where he teaches energy regulation and market design. Mr. Pototschnig holds a degree in Economics from Milan's Bocconi University and an M.Sc. in Econometrics and Mathematical Economics from the London School of Economics at the University of London.

Francesca VALENTE is Head of the Regulatory and Antitrust Department of Italy for Enel; she has held this position since its creation in July 2014. Prior to that, she was Head of Regulatory and Antitrust Practices of Enel's Engineering and Research and Infrastructure and Network Divisions. Before that, she headed Enel's Regulatory and Antitrust Department within its Market Division upon its creation in 2006. In 2000, she was named Senior Manager for coordinating Regulatory Affairs and Antitrust Practices of Enel's Generation and Management Division, including both generation and trading activities of the wholesale market related to Enel Produzione SpA and to Enel Trade SpA. Ms. Valente joined Enel in 1994 as Manager of Legal and Regulatory Affairs of the Commercial Department within the Generation Division of Enel SpA. Valente graduated with a degree in Law from LUISS Guido Carli University in Rome.

Miroslav ZIMERMANN is an energy attaché of the Permanent Representation of the Slovak Republic in the European Union in Brussels, an employee of Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Slovak Republic, and a member of Atomic Questions Group of the European Council, which focuses on nuclear safety. He is also a participant in the European Council's Working Group for Energy.
